



## CONTEXT

Since 2016, Staffordshire Community Energy (SCE) has been working with University Hospitals of North Midlands (UHNM) and Beat the Cold (BtC) to deliver the Keep Warm, Keep Well (KWKW) project.

This innovative initiative links community-owned solar PV on hospital roofs with support for NHS patients living in fuel poverty, helping them stay warm, reduce bills, and improve health.

## **KEY ACHIEVEMENTS**



By reducing energy costs for hospitals, KWKW frees up resources to directly support patients. The project has also improved patients' wellbeing and reduced hospital readmissions:

- 22.8% reduction in admissions within 30 days
- 38% reduction in emergency readmissions
- £200,000 savings for the local Clinical Commissioning Group

Patients also benefit directly at home through energy advice, support with heating systems, and access to schemes such as the Warmer Homes Discount and Priority Services Register.
